

# Camp Kieve & Wavus Camp Suggested Clothing & Equipment List Introductory/Junior Sessions

## A CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT NOTE

Please consider everything on this list a **requirement** and not a suggestion. There is a ton of good and bad gear on the market. Please do not hesitate to contact us if you have any questions. **It is important to remember that layers are the key to being warm enough should the weather change.** You can always take off layers to be cooler but if you are freezing and don't have enough layers to put on you are going to be very miserable and the experience will be somewhat diminished. So layers, layers, layers!

**Note:** When ordering items and having them directly sent to camp, it is a good idea to have the company permanently mark your items with your child's name so that they might be identified and returned at the end of camp. Please remind your child that if he/she buys anything from the Camp Store, he/she **must** put their name in it. Often times it is really busy and we may forget to mention it to them.



**IMPORTANT** - Camper's name should be clearly marked on **every** article, using sew-on labels, iron-on labels, or indelible ink. ## ESSENTIAL TRIP EQUIPMENT

Items listed in this section are **required** for camper health, safety and comfort while out on wilderness trips. **All introductory/junior campers go on one overnight trip.** They **must** have the following items (one each, unless otherwise noted).

- Rainsuit** - must be waterproof, this is very important - no ponchos please
- Sleeping bag** with stuff sack - we suggest a 20- 30° F rating - goose down **not** recommended
- Duffel Bag** or any bag to fit both sleeping bag & clothes will be fine.
- Life Vest / P.F.D.** (Personal Flotation Device) - we can loan one - but your own might fit better than ours
- Day Pack** - school backpack is fine
- Flashlight or Headlamp** with extra fresh batteries
- Water bottle, Canteen, or CamelBak**
- Swimsuit**



*Please be sure that all items are marked with camper name*

### UPPER AND LOWER BODY LAYERS

- Long underwear** - synthetic mid-weight - tops and bottoms
- Long Pants** - quick-dry or fleece (not blue jeans). Unlined sports "warm-ups" or windpants work well
- Pullover Polar Fleece or zip up Jacket** or similar outer garment such as wool sweater to retain body heat
- Windbreaker (1)**
- Lighter fleece top or synthetic top** ~ for layering
- Baseball Hat or Visor**
- Warm hat (polar fleece or wool)**

### BOOTS AND FOOTWEAR

- Sneakers** - ones that won't fall off - if you own 2 pair, bring both
- Water shoes** for kayaking, canoeing and swimming/wading on wilderness trips; must have heel strap & closed toes
- Athletic socks (2 pairs)**

## IN CAMP ITEMS

- Camp Logo T-shirt, (1)** any style. Required for Sundays (*available in the Camp Store*)
- Pajamas, warm (1)**
- Pajamas, lightweight (1)**
- 1 plain white 100% cotton t-shirt** - to tie dye
- 1 Bandana** (*available in the Camp Store*)
- Short sleeve T-shirts (2)**
- Long sleeve shirt (1)** - keeps bugs away
- Shorts (2)**
- Long pants (2)** - jeans, khakis, sweatpants, etc.
- Sweatshirt (2)** (*available in Camp Store*)
- Underwear (5 pairs)**
- Belt (1)**
- Socks (5 pairs)**
- 1 Laundry bag** (marked with camper name)
- 1 pillow**
- 1 blanket**
- 1 facecloth and hand towel**
- 2 sets of sheets and pillow cases** - twin or single bed size - regular length
- 2 bath/beach towels**
- Sunglasses** - with a float band



**Note** - Campers tend to wear the same clothes everyday, so our lists are really quite adequate.

### TOILETRIES

- Toothbrush and toothpaste
- Soap
- Shampoo/ Conditioner (in unbreakable containers)
- Personal hygiene items
- Bag to keep toiletries together

### OPTIONAL ITEMS

- Insect Repellent
- Sunscreen
- Chapstick or lip balm with sunscreen
- Small notebook with pen
- Summer Reading, books, etc.
- Stationery and stamps appropriate for the size of the envelope
- Pens or pencils, writing journal
- Playing cards, board games & other non-electronic games
- Tennis racquet and tennis balls
- Lacrosse stick
- Baseball/softball cap
- Baseball glove and ball
- Fishing rod and tackle
- Disposable Camera (**please mark with camper name**)
- Crazy Creek Chair (*available at camp stores with parent permission*)



### PRESCRIPTION MEDICINE

Please bring any prescription medicine in the bottle as dispensed by the drugstore with physician directions for use.

**Please do not repackage it.**

### CAMP STORES

#### "PADDLE AND THISTLE" AND "PRIDE AND PASSION"

Many items are available in our camp store. There are small items such as insect repellent, lip balm, toothbrushes, bandanas, water bottles, etc. There are also custom Wavus and Kieve t-shirts, sweatshirts, mugs, wristbands, post cards and more. We will charge purchases to your account, which is billed at the end of the camp season

### EXTRA ITEMS

There are many themes used during the camp sessions. Your child may want to bring costume items that can be used for "dress up" or themed items (example: favorite animal, Christmas in July, Olympics, Pirate Day, rock 'n roll, 4<sup>th</sup> of July). These items could include crazy hats, feathery-type boas, cowboy gear, super hero items, themed t-shirt, etc. Use your imagination!
